Any part of the safety system that fails to be checked or fails to be operated correctly will result in a NO for that part of the process, any emergency 'stop' of any assessment (for purposes of ensuring safety) will result in a FAIL.

Med	<p>1 (RED) = A fail is very likely. Candidates with 2 RED will fail their assessment. 2 (AMBER) = A fail is possible, a defer likely. If there are 4 or more items with this score, then the candidate will be failed. Candidates with up to three AMBER scores have potential to be moved to a pass during assessment, however, this is unlikely. 3= (GREEN) Candidate at expected standard. 4= (GREEN) Candidate is clearly highly competent and their performance is both Autonomous and of high quality (perhaps they can perform a task whilst also considering other subjects). LINE= Where an assessor has decided not to assess a certain item (perhaps as it was not relevant to the assessment, a line will be crossed through the coloured boxes. 1,2,3,4= The numbers are purely used to assist those who may find the colours difficult to decipher.</p>

PASS = Candidate demonstrates sufficient competency, they will attain ERCA qualification

FAIL = Candidate needs to attend an entirely new assessment

DEFER = This is not a PASS, it is not a FAIL, DEFER means the assessor felt the candidate was close to a pass, but one key skill was not at standard and the candidate is required to return to be re-assessed on this item/s. Extensive notes need to be made on the back of this form with suggestions of what the candidate must do before re-assessment and how long the re-assessment should be and in what format.  
If a candidate is re-assessed for any items marked in a RED zone, an entirely new assessment sheet should be used with results notes, this can be attached to the original for filing.
